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The OD2A Grant's purpose is to advance system-level activities and improve health equity by implementing advanced clinician and health system initiatives. The work completed over the course of 5 years includes addressing state-level systems, statewide barriers, standardization, and dissemination across the state by developing resources, training, and capacity relevant to the management of pain and the screening, diagnosis, MOUD delivery, and linkage to care of patients with OUD and SUD.



Data is collected through multiple methods, primarily via comprehensive patient chart review. Patients are identified using EPIC reports for encounters at the St. Cloud Hospital Emergency Department, the Empath unit, and the Monticello Emergency Department.

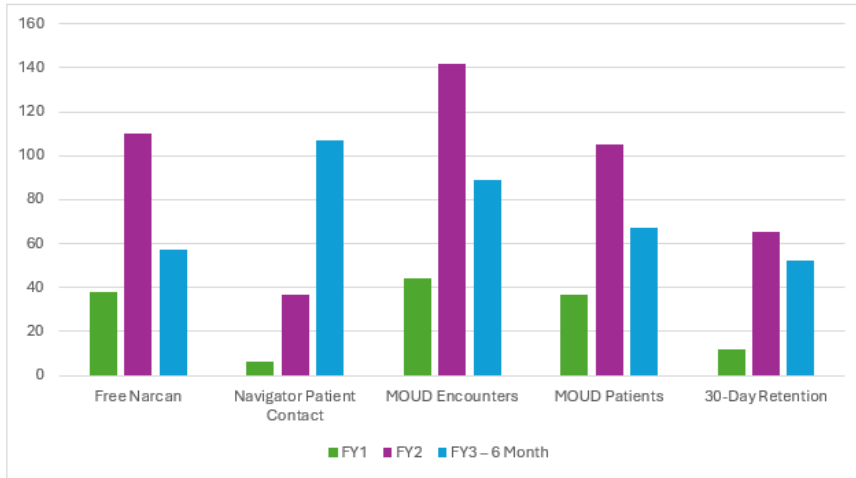
These reports capture data related to medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD), including administrations and prescriptions written during emergency department visits, as well as the free distribution of naloxone. Patients are also monitored for retention in care 30 days post ER visit.

MOUD TREATMENT IMPROVEMENT
